Peter Lohman. Distributed document regarding community gardens and rain barrel collection. Wanted to form committees to sort out environmental feasibility studies including recycling.

Brad Sellars. 2675 Crazyhorse. Wants to know how to go about getting approval for a fence already built on his property that is 6' high. Since leash laws are not being enforced, he would like to keep the fence as is. His neighbor Joyce likes the fence and would like to see it remain. He will submit pictures. It's a \$400K house and he would like to keep the nice fence around the nice house. Gus told him to fill out all forms and submit them and the pictures to Hector. Gus told Brad that we don't dictate fence materials. Chris told Brad that we have approved horizontal fences. When submitting paperwork, tell us fence is already built and ask for variance. We are understanding.

Cary Peele. Wants to volunteer to be on roads committee. Wants to get Broken Bow on substandard roads list. Would like short term plan to deal with 19 pot holes.

Tom Lappin. Road study: 40 cars per hour on General Williamson to Geronimo. Told Cary to be careful what you wish for because paving the road will create a thoroughfare. Tom drove 35mph down BB with no issues. Suggested we will have traffic if we pave the road.

Chris Scheetz: Broken Bow on list to get paved this year.

Bob Walsh. Texas A&M forest service came out to look at oak trees. Surveyed neighborhood. Showed where oak wilt persisted over the years. Number one cause of oak wilt is people cutting trees during wrong time of year.. Suggests we put a sign at front of neighborhood regarding rules for cutting trees. A&M has a system that subsidizes an oak wilt program. If diseased trees left in place disease spreads through the air. Board should consider having A&M come and help us prevent oak wilt.
